





SHARE YOUR MEMORIES OF NORTH NORFOLK IN WW2

In the build-up to two major WW2 anniversaries, a Councillor is seeking memories of home life and experiences in wartime North Norfolk.

Memories of life on the Home Front in North Norfolk during World War Two are being sought ahead of the 75th anniversaries of VE (Victory in Europe) and VJ (Victory over Japan) days on Friday, May 8 and Monday, August 10 respectively. This year also marks the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Britain, when the Royal Air Force successfully defended our skies from relentless assault by the Luftwaffe. North Norfolk District Councillor John Toye is heading the search for memories of life in our area as Britain fought in the conflict which raged in Europe and across the world between 1939 to 1945.

Life for the soldiers fighting in the Armed Forces changed forever – but life back in Norfolk changed dramatically too, with evacuees escaping the Blitz to live in



homes in our area, women working in industries previously staffed by the men who were now at war, the formation of the land army to grow vital food supplies and the Home Guard patrolling our shores as Norfolk and the nation braced themselves for the very real possibility of invasion by the Axis powers. If you have memories, pictures or anecdotes from life in North Norfolk during those unforgettable times, or if you are planning any events to commemorate the applicance of the Battle of Britain. VE Day your council would

the anniversaries of the Battle of Britain, VE Day or VJ Day, your council would like to hear from you.

Cllr. John Toye said: "As Armed Forces champion working with the council's Community Support Team, we are trying to gather information about what was going on in North Norfolk around the time of these events. Additionally, we are

talking to all groups and organisations that are taking part in these celebrations

to try and assist where we can and help others with their planning and finding sources of funding.

"We would like to find out what went on in your towns/villages/parishes during the war while the men and women from the village were away. Who took over the doing of their work? Did the land army work on the farms, did you have buildings that provided billets for service personnel or used as convalescent

homes, or for POWs? Were there boat owners that took part in the D-Day landings, was there land that was used as an airfield?

"We would like grassroots stories that have come from those who were left behind or passed it on to the next generation. Our aim is to put these on a map of the parishes in North Norfolk."

STARLING RESCUED FROM DRAIN **COVER IN DOWNHAM MARKET** 12/03/20

A starling had to be rescued by fire crews and the RSPCA after it got stuck in a drain cover. A member of the public spotted the bird's head popping through a hole in the drain in Downham Market, Norfolk, on Tuesday and contacted the animal welfare charity. RSPCA officer Naemi Kilbey had to call the fire brigade to remove the cover before she was able to catch the bird.

She said it was "certainly one of the more unusual" rescues she had done.

'When you attend an animal rescue, you can usually work out how they got themselves into the predicament - but in the case of this

little starling, I really don't know how on earth he got himself there," Ms Kilbey said. The starling was taken to East Winch Wildlife Centre where its health is being monitored.

It is expected to be released into the wild at the weekend.

NORTH NORFOLK DISTRICT COUNCIL WILL NO LONGER CONTINUE ITS LEGAL BATTLE AGAINST PLANS TO BUILD TWO SEPARATE WIND TURBINES AT BODHAM AND SELBRIGG.

Despite strong objections from the Council and local residents, who argued against the turbines on grounds of the harm to landscape, heritage assets and wildlife would not be outweighed by the comparatively limited renewable

energy benefits,

the Planning Inspectorate has upheld its original decision to allow both turbines.

Leader of the Council Sarah Bütikofer commented: "We are extremely

disappointed by the latest decision of the Planning Inspectorate in the long battle to oppose these applications.

"Councillors across the political spectrum have long worked together on this important issue for the community but the legal processes available to us have now been exhausted.

"We have taken legal advice from Counsel who have advised us during this eight-year fight that a further challenge would have no prospect of success. We might not like the decisions but the inspector has been neither irrational nor made a serious error of law which could have affected the outcome of his decision.

"We are writing to the Planning Inspectorate asking for a couple of inaccuracies to be corrected, but these will not materially change the outcome.

"We ourselves are very dismayed, but as a council we have a responsibility to protect the interests of all our residents living throughout our wider area - and it would not be prudent to pursue this case further."

In reaching his decision, Planning Inspector Paul Griffiths concluded that 'while the proposal[s] would cause some harm in terms of landscape character and visual amenity, the overall impact of the wind turbine[s] would be limited'. He went on to state he disagreed that many heritage assets would be affected and, in his view, only Baconsthorpe Castle complex would be affected by both turbines

and Barningham Hall only affected by the Bodham turbine.

However, while harm was identified to these highly-graded heritage assets, the

Inspector concluded the public benefits of renewable energy generation would more than outweigh the harm identified. The Inspector concluded both schemes complied with the Council's policy on renewable energy and, noting the District Council had declared a climate emergency in April 2019, stated 'it would be something of a contradiction to resist further policy-compliant schemes in the District'.

COUNCIL CALLS FOR GOVERNMENT TO ADVISE AGAINST HOLIDAY TRAVEL

North Norfolk District Council is joining a number of local authorities in East Anglia and around the UK in expressing concern about holiday-makers visiting their areas during this critical period in the fight against Coronavirus.

Popular tourist spots including beaches along the North Norfolk coast were very busy over the weekend - despite

Government guidelines on social distancing and the closure earlier in the week of restaurants, bars and many other businesses which normally meet the needs of tourists.

North Norfolk District Council Leader Sarah Bütikofer says the authority has contacted Norfolk County Council and neighbouring coastal districts at Great Yarmouth and King's Lynn and West Norfolk to discuss the matter and raise it as an urgent priority with central government.

It follows a similar statement issued by Cornwall's local authority, where the same issues are occurring.

Cllr. Bütikofer commented: "Normally of course we welcome visitors to our beautiful part of the world with open arms and we are all very much looking forward to happier and safer times when we can do so again.

"However during these difficult weeks when as a nation we are implementing firm social distancing guidelines laid down by the Government, a combination of tourists and those temporarily occupying holiday homes in our area could increase the population of North Norfolk by between 10 and 20 per cent at any given time. This is not only potentially unsafe in terms of facilitating the spread of the virus, it also places significant extra strain on local resources and infrastructure.

"Our priority is the safety of everyone - residents and those thinking of visiting - during this absolutely vital stage in the nation's battle against Coronavirus and we are consulting with our neighbour authorities in the county urgently to raise this with central government.

"The Government needs to update its policy and advice on social distancing to specifically advise against taking holidays, including those visiting caravan parks, in areas like ours at this time. This is to help us all to work together as a society to combat the threat of Coronavirus as effectively as possible."



INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION FOR LOCAL CHESS PLAYER

Local chess enthusiast, John Wickham, has gained recognition on the international stage. The Fédération Internationale des Échecs (FIDE) / International Chess Federation has appointed John as a FIDE Arbiter at their 90th FIDE Congress, held in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.

An Arbiter's role is to ensure the smooth running of events and to act in a similar manner to a football referee - sometimes using technology to spot

infringements! John will now be involved in running international chess events taking place in the UK and abroad. John already has a very illustrious chess career. He is Honorary Life Vice-President of the English Chess Federation (ECF), Chairman of Norfolk County Chess Association (NCCA) and the East Anglian Chess Union (EACU) and, as a



Qualified ECF Arbiter, is involved in organising and running most Chess Congresses in East Anglia and is a regular Arbiter at the British Chess Championships. In addition to this, John regularly plays chess for Aylsham Chess Club.

SHERINGHAM AND DISTRICT PHILATELIC SOCIETY

Jim Farrell, the society secretary, presented a display entitled "Pages from my Albums" at the March meeting on Monday 9th. He explained how he goes about collecting stamps by likening himself to a magpie! If he comes across a stamp that particularly appeals to him, he will often branch out from what

he is currently collecting and start a new collection! In this way, he had started to gather King George VI stamps, which he had brought to show us this evening. During this era, GB stamps were designed for use in GB and the same design was issued for all the British colonies, the only difference being in the colony's name on the stamp. These are known as omnibus issues and were used to celebrate occasions such as Victory (1946), Royal Silver Wedding (1948) and the Universal Postal Union. Gradually, the colonies (and then as independent countries) began to produce their own designs of stamp and Jim had examples from Pitcairn Islands and St. Helena. The second part of Jim's display focussed on European countries including Finland and France in the 1930s and 1940s, with a particular interest in charity stamps,



which many European countries produce as a means of raising funds for worthwhile causes e.g Red Cross. The next meeting will be on Monday April 6th at West Runton Church Hall, 7.30pm. The speaker will be Chris Southgate from NNPS. Further details from Jim 01263 721043 or Jerry 01263 579529.
